Any amendments to the IECC are reasonable and enforceable; number of amendments are kept to a minimum to increase enforceability and reduce confusion. Clarify that REEEA approval will not required for permit (job) specific alternate materials and methods approvals granted by the local building officials (which number 100s in a given year).

Local jurisdiction need clear ability per 10L to accept appropriate alternatives
